Basics about the Bible

- *The Bible is divided into two parts: The Old Testament and the New Testament.
- *There are 66 books in the Bible: 39 in the OT and 27 in the NT
- *The first four books of the NT tell the life of Jesus. We call them the "gospels". The word gospel means "good news".
- *The Bible was written over a span of 1500 years by more than 40 different authors on three continents.
- *The first book ever printed on a printing press was a Bible.
- *More Bibles are printed each year than any other book.
- *The bible was written in three languages: Hebrew, Greek and Aramaic.
- *There are a variety of literary styles represented in the Bible: Poetry, historical narrative, song, romance, personal correspondence, memoirs, satires, biography, law, prophecy, parable, etc.
- *The Bible is primarily about Jesus from beginning to end.
