<u>Fault-finding</u>: Humble people are far more focused on all the areas where they have to improve and grow and not everyone else's growth areas.

<u>A harsh spirit</u>: Proud people treat others disrespectfully. Humble people treat others with gentleness.

<u>Superficiality</u>: Proud people are far more concerned with image and little interest in genuine accountability.

<u>Defensiveness</u>: Humble people can handle challenge, criticism and rebuke without giving up.

<u>Desperation for attention</u>: Proud people always turn the conversation back to themselves.

<u>Neglecting others:</u> Proud people don't care much about the weak, unattractive or the broken.
